EMPLOYMENT HISTORY

March 2000 * Present Time

Eontec

Eontec is a Multi-Channel Banking Software Provider. **Eontec** uses a Methodology * a factory of industry standard Java components for building scaleable, distributed and multi-channel Banking solutions.

March 2000 * November 2000

After completing a 5 week training course (OO design, EJB*s and JSP*s) I began to work on a Loans, Mortgage, and Line Of credit application (applet) for League Data (a large group of credit unions in North East Canada). This project was originally built as a Container Managed Project, Interfacing with an Oracle Database, using **Weblogic** 4.5.1 as the EJB server. During this time my key responsibilities were: 1) To incorporate Front End validation in the applet by means of Swing Text Fields. 2) To integrate with a third Party Credit Check company (Equifax) sending a dataset and formatting the response to display on the screen in a particular format. I also had to enable printing of the response * as well as the storing and retrieving of the response (~90K) in the database.

November 2000 * December 2001

In November 2000 I became Technical Team Lead of the LeagueData Project. My key responsibilities Nov * April included: Converting the 91 EJB*s from CMP to Bean Managed Persistence. Integrating the system with an A2200 mainframe (Host) and an Informix Database. Converting the Cobol Strings returned from the Host to vectors by using metadata. I was also responsible for liaising with the client * agreeing timelines for completion of tasks, and delegating appropriate resources to work on specific tasks ensuring that timelines were met.

May 2001 * December 2001: After the conversion of the application to BMP a number of Changes were requested, as well as a number of enhancements added to the application. An example of these changes would be the addition of new payment frequencies, and more third party integration - Integrating with an insurance provider - sending up requests in an XML format and reformatting the response. I was responsible for ensuring that all the calculations within the application were accurate. My role also included version management of the code. I was also responsible for the setting up of a Virtual Private Network between Canada and Dublin so as more work could be done off site.

In October 2001 we upgraded the system to **Weblogic** 5.1 from **Weblogic** 4.5.1 * This also meant upgrading the code from EJB specs 1.0 to 1.1.

In December 2001 this project went into Production.
